

#### From Darkness into Light

*Early in the morning, while it was still dark...* 'That's where Easter began two millennia ago. It's where Easter still begins now: in the dark. Easter began with fear and bewilderment. The first disciples had to hope *in the midst* of their struggles, in the heart of the shadows.' [1]

... While it was still dark, Mary came running to the tomb, 'while there was no hope, while she was in despair, while she felt lost, alone and bereft. The dawning of hope arises in those places where we are most hopeless, lost in the darkness of our despair. It is a hope that we are unable to engineer ourselves because it is a much larger hope than we can ever imagine. Unless the small picture that we have of our lives is shattered, we will not be able to awaken to the fuller picture that is possible.' [2] 'Every life crisis carries within it the kernels of a reversal, a renewal, an expansion, a leap in consciousness, and a letting go of the old and a birth of the new.' [3]

'The Easter message of *life* is found in the midst of death, not apart from it. The Easter message of *hope* arises from the centre of our sorrows and losses, not apart from them.

The Easter message of *new possibilities* is at the heart of business as usual, not apart from it.

Death is real but it is not the end.

Those are truths of this day. They do not change the circumstances of our life but they change us in the midst of those circumstances. They do not eliminate our difficulties and problems, but they see us through those difficulties and problems.' [4]

May the spirit and light of this Easter morning lead us from darkness into the light of peace and hope and transfiguration. We were sent here to search for the light of Easter in our hearts, and when we find it we are meant to give it away generously. [5]
