

"What are you looking for?" 'How we answer Jesus' question determines how we live, how we navigate the tragedies and pain of life, and how we relate to God and our neighbour. We answer it every minute of every day by our choices, the decisions we make, the priorities we establish and the relationships we create.' [1] Underlying each personal response, there is a common search for our true home, 'that place where we discover who we are, where we are coming from and where we are going to. It is where we learn to love and be loved.' [2] Jesus tells us where to find our true home. 'Make your home in Me as I make mine in you.' (John 15:4) Like the apostles, we may ask, "Where do you live?" and with a sense of anticipation and awe we may respond to Jesus' invitation, "Come and see."

'How many times have we heard a child say: "Come and see" There is excitement and joy in their voice, maybe even a sense of urgency. Their words are an invitation to share in their discovery, to experience their world, and to participate in their life. It is an invitation to let our life and theirs come together as one. That's why we can't just sit back and say, "No, just tell me about it." That's not an acceptable answer. Children know that information and relationship are not interchangeable. We never outgrow the desire to invite and to be invited, to share our life with another in a deep and meaningful way, and to participate in something larger than ourselves. Would we rather read a travel brochure or travel to a new land? Would we rather *know about* Christ or *know* him?' [1]

'The only way we can get to know another person is by immediate presence. You have to be around them to pick up their real energy; to experience how they live and how they love.' [3] 'Our relationship with Christ, with one another, and with ourselves must be a firsthand experience. A firsthand experience won't let us stay where we are. It moves us to a new place. It transforms us in a way that information and facts about Jesus never will.' [1]

Lockdown 3: Church Closure - Message from Fr Anton Fernandopulle

Since the Prime Minister announced the current lockdown, we have continued to celebrate Mass in both St Aidan and St Agnes.

However, the Archbishop, in his New Year letter to priests, has written this: Although I have circulated the recent government advice on the opening of churches, I want to emphasise that the final decision in this regard is yours. Only you know your people, their age profile and the risks that they are likely to be exposed to and present to others. You have to consider your volunteers and stewards.

So, after a lot of thinking and hesitation I have decided that as of last weekend we will cease the celebration of Mass in both churches. Nor will either of the churches be open for private prayer.

There are several reasons for this: The number of cases in our area is very high (1118 cases per 100,000 at the time of writing). The new strain is more virulent than previously. A good number of people who come to our Mass are over 70. Even though there is no obligation, attending Mass is a further risk. It is important to ensure the safety of our stewards. My heartfelt thanks goes to all of them for all the incredible work they have done over the past months.

Despite all the efforts made to make our Churches Covid secure, it is still a gathering of people for 30 minutes with the risk of spreading the virus.

As you know I have been eager to celebrate Mass as often as needed so it is with great regret that I make this decision. It will be for as short a time as possible and the situation will be reviewed at the end of January.

Mass will be live-streamed every <u>Sunday from 11am</u>. Please follow the parish Facebook and the website for the newsletter, daily reflections, mediations etc. If you would like the newsletter to be emailed to you or sent via WhatsApp, please call the parish office. (0151 489 3085)

It will still be possible for funerals to be live streamed.

I hope to see you all soon. Until then please take good care of yourselves and your families.
