

The Epiphany

What we celebrate on the feast of the Epiphany is that it is God who is manifest, not our formulations of God! The mystery of the Epiphany is that God is perfectly hidden and perfectly revealed in the same physical place. God is shining forth in the most unwanted and unsuspected of people and places, in the material and even vulnerable world. [1]

In 'A Woman Wrapped in Silence', John W. Lynch beautifully captures the true meaning of today's feast. "These were men who saw a star and went to follow it, who heard a Name and cut the ground and could not sleep until they found the Bearer of the Name. And these were men so simple they were unconfused by simple things and, like the shepherds, found no strangeness in the child's swaddling bands. Across the star's long way they had known whom they had sought, and they had heard the names upon Isaiah's scrolls: "Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace." But not in these names was heard what gentleness they found, nor talk of threadbare shawls, nor dignity of her who was a queen. And when they fell upon their knees and set their hands along the floor, her heart cried to their hearts and heard their searching and their deeper need. There have been some who say that theirs was a Wisdom that could stoop to humbleness when they had sought a king's house for a King." [2]

Epiphanies manifest the mysteries that are always beyond words. The Magi set out on a journey that would change them forever. They trusted their deep intuitions symbolised by the star and followed it outside of their comfort zone into a new territory and there they humbly bowed down before mystery. Each of us is challenged to do the same. When we find God in the most unwanted and unsuspected of people and places, we go back 'home' by a different route, yet realigned correctly with what-is. Reality is still the best ally of God, and God always comes disguised as our life. [1]
