What is it you plan to do with your one wild and precious life?

One of the recurrent themes throughout the Lenten season is the compassion and mercy of our God. It is something that we constantly need to be reminded about. Our God is always faithful and consistent. His love for us never changes, no matter how we behave. It has to be that way because our God not only loves, he IS love. Love is of the very essence of his being; he cannot not love.

The first reading today is a strong invitation to reflect on the fact that repentance (i.e. change) is not only turning away from something bad. It is turning to that which is good. The reading from Exodus tells us of God's appearance to Moses in the burning bush on Mt. Horeb or Sinai. This passage is so important, for it establishes the identity of the people of Israel by disclosing the identity of their God. Israel's God is not a disengaged monarch, but a loving parent who has compassion on his suffering children. The outstanding characteristic of the God who appears to Moses in the bush is mercy. Mercy is a special form of love, the kind of love that one has for a person who is suffering. It is a love that shares the struggles of those who struggle and experiences the pain of those who are in need. Mercy is

compassion, sharing in the distress of those who are in any way afflicted. This is the way God relates to the people of Israel enslaved in Egypt: I know their suffering and have come down to rescue them.


This is the God we are asked to turn to during Lent. The God of compassion and mercy invites us to let God's great mercy and compassion touch our hearts. We are also called to share that mercy with each other, trying to lift the burdens from each other's shoulders and set free the oppressed. Being repentant means turning to the God whose mercy to us can make us truly compassionate to each other. Faith in this God of mercy can make us people of mercy. It can make the Christian community a community of compassion. Really turning to this God can make us people who help heal the wounds of our struggling world.

In today's Gospel we have the image of God as the compassionate Gardener. The demanding landowner's attitude is "Produce fruit or be cut down." But that is not who God is and that is not how God deals with God's people. God does not cut down life. God gives, sustains, and grows life. Rather, these words of Jesus are the words of a compassionate and caring gardener who seeks to nourish life, who is willing to get down on his hands and knees, to dig around in the dirt of our life, to water, even spread a little manure, and then trust that fruit will grow. This gardener sees possibilities for life that we often cannot see in our own or each other's lives.

We are right to hear urgency and necessity in Jesus' call to repentance. This is not because God is vindictive but because life is short, precious, and sacred.

. It is not because God is retribution but because God is love. Jesus does not seem as concerned about why people die as why people do not live. Everyone dies but not all truly live. Too often and too easily we perish even before we die – through our fear, prejudices, judgments and condemnations, the need for control, the victimization of others, and our impoverishment of God.

Jesus' call to repentance is the invitation to choose life. Live or perish. We choose which way we will turn. We must decide where we place our trust – in the mechanics of a distorted cause and effect or in the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob; the God who has observed our misery, heard our cry, and come to deliver us.

Going Forward

"Tell me, what is it you plan to do

with your one wild and precious life?"

Mary Oliver's question is at the heart of Jesus' call to repentance. Her question underlies and guides our Lenten journey. Repentance is the means to reclaiming the "one wild and precious life" entrusted to us. Repentance is the way to life, the way of becoming most authentically who we are and who, at the deepest level, we long to be. What might repentance look like in your life? Ultimately, repentance is about choosing to live and live fully. So choose, and if you find you have made a wrong choice, choose again. It is never too late. "One more year," the gardener told the owner. That is not about time but about forgiveness, grace, love, and second chances. So, "Tell me, what is it you plan to do with your one wild and precious life?"
