'Parishes of St Agnes and St Aidan'. Mary led us in 'choir practice' as she taught us all a song about Father Abraham. The drama day is usually on a Friday but this was changed as we were departing for the UK on Friday evening. We also had to finish early today as the sisters needed to be home in time for a prayer meeting. It was also decided how many of the children would be joining the trip to the beach on Friday.

At times, we were confused about some of the arrangements but we slowly realized there was order in the Albanian method of doing things. So we eventually learned to forget about the way things are a done in the UK. When we returned we celebrated Mass in one of chapels in the Seminary. During this Mass we listened to 'Circle of Life' by Elton John as part of our meditation and shared our personal reflections of what we had experienced today.

Day 7: 03/08/12

We set off this morning in two coaches to pick up the group for the beach trip. We had been advised to bring along our own packed lunch and enough water for the day. We met up with a numbers of resident from the Mother Teresa's Sisters orphanage who were staying near the beach for a week along with Spanish and Italian helpers.

The children had a wonderful time from the moment we arrived. It was yet another very warm day. It was great to see the happy face of God in the happiness of children. At times kids spoke to us in Albanian and we just nodded and they were happy we were listening though we did not understand. After a great time on the beach it was time for us to say good by to the Mother Teresa's Sisters, the teenage volunteers (animators) and the kids from the village. Many shed tears as we left the village.

We got back to the Seminary as quickly as possible to pack our bags and clean the rooms we had been occupying. We left the Seminary around 8pm and arrived in Tirana the capitol of Albania around 9.30pm. We spent the night at the Caritas house and left around 3am to the Mother Teresa Airport. We arrived in Stanstead airport around 10am and thanked God for all that the he has done through us and for us while in Albania.

We hope and pray that many more volunteers will be inspired to join us on our next two week summer camp in 2013. This is a very rewarding and worthwhile way to spend part of the summer and all for the Glory of God We managed to borrow a tarpaulin which we attached to the fence to give the little ones some shade and we also bought a huge sheet which Bryan ingeniously rigged up for the same purpose.

The children enjoyed a variety of games today. They were thrilled with the skipping ropes even though they had no idea how to use them at first, but after some instructions they began to improve. At the end of the day,

we came together with the youth leaders, and the sisters to discus how to organize the next day's events and also shared what things had worked and how we could improve, but even though there was a bit of a language barrier, we communicated quiet well with the animators, despite the age difference. Once we arrived back in the Seminary we all were very tired due to the heat. Our group then celebrated mass this evening (which always inspires us) so we were able to talk about how we were lifted by the events we had seen or participated in.

Day 5: Wednesday the 1st of August

Realizing that the children needed drinking water, we set up a system with a table filled with small bottles of water. These were replenished throughout the day from a nearby tap which was out of bounds to the children.

Today the children had fun playing water games and the winners were given prizes we had brought from England

At the end of today's session, just like every other day all the groups gathered together to say a few short prayers, then the helpers distributed snacks and juice drinks to each child to ensure that they had something to eat that day. There is no guarantee that there would be a meal available to them once they got home.

Day 6: Thursday 2nd August.

We walked to the camp today, rather than wait for the minibus, thus enabling us to be fully organized by the time the children started to arrive – they are coming earlier each day and are keen to help us set up the benches.

One of the things that upset some of our group members earlier in the week, was how certain children were sent out of the summer camp even though they did not appear to have been that naughty. It transpired that there had been disputes in the evenings and this was carried over to the next day so they would be sent out to the 'sin bin' for a certain time before being allowed back in. As the week progressed this proved to be an effective deterrent as the 'sin bin' times became shorter.

Today we started to rehearse what the children would be doing for their drama day. Each group had to come up with an idea which tied in with the Abraham/ Faith Year theme. .

Report from the summer camp in Shkodar, Albania

Day 1: Saturday 28th July

The day started very early after setting off from Huyton at midnight. Bryan did a brilliant job driving us, non-stop, in St Aidan's School minibus to Stanstead Airport where we met up with Ronnie, Mary O'Gorman's sister.

Our good luck began at the check-in desk where the BelAir security attendant, who happened to be from Shkodar in Albania, showed a lot of interest in our mission to Shkodar. We were then checked in altogether, as a group. Our luggage was amalgamated and went through without a hitch, even though we were over-weight! The icing on the cake was being given the best seats, with extra leg room, at no extra charge!

We landed in Mother Teresa International Airport in Tirana around 1pm local time. We were greeted by 35c heat! After gathering our luggage and changing some of our sterling into local currency(Leke), we were greeted at the gate by The Missionaries of Charity Sisters (Mother Teresa Sisters). We all piled into their minibus and set out on a one and a half hour journey north, to our destination of Shkodar. We were welcomed to the Seminary by Fr. Martin (a lecturer from England based at the Seminary here in Shkodar). This was to be our residence during our stay in Albania. Fr. Martin helped us with some local knowledge to guide us through any pitfalls.

We then visited the convent of the Missionaries of Charity (M.C.), which was only a few minutes walk away, and met up with the youth helpers (animators). After introducing ourselves, discussions were held on what we should expect at the summer camp.

We spent some time this evening sorting out all the supplies which had been very generously donated not only by our own parishioners but also by the wider community in Huyton, and divided them into summer camp material and donations to the residents of the M.C. Sister's orphanage.

Day 2: Sunday the 29th July

Today some of us awoke at 4.00 am to the sound of local monks chanting; calls to prayer from the local mosques; followed by the roosters at 5:30; with two sets of church bells joining in at 7.00am; the latter continued for the rest of the morning! We went for a walk around Shkodar which is the biggest town in northern Albania and also the nearest to Montenegro.

We met up at the M.C.Sisters' convent at 4pm and set out for the place where the summer camp would be held. This is the home of one of the volunteers which has a football pitch area around the back. The land was generously made available for this purpose. We helped arrange the benches for the first outdoor mass at this venue, which was concelebrated by Fr Anton and Fr Francesco (*an Italian priest based in Shkodar*). We felt quite privileged to be present at this special occasion. The entire Mass was in Albanian but we were able to follow it fairly well as we had brought Mass sheets from home.

Day 3: Monday 30^{th July}

We walked down to the convent at 8am to drive over to the summer camp site in Kiras, a large, high, meshed –fenced, dusty football pitch area. We all wore rose coloured T-Shirts we had bought from ASDA the day before we left and were easily noticed by people wherever we went. This proved to be a stroke of genius as the young Albanian animators all had coloured T-shirts to distinguish their teams. A large number of excited children arrived at the summer camp this morning. We introduced ourselves to everybody present and were welcomed by all with open arms.

Fr. Anton gave a short reflection based on the Faith of Abraham which was translated by Sr. Marylene. The Sisters had decided to use the story of Abraham as it would also appeal to the large number of Muslim children present. As there are children of different faiths especially Muslim and Christians, using the story of Abraham was a way of bringing all of them together. We were reminded by the young people and the Sisters that this is the Year of Faith.

After the prayers and reflections we divided the children into three groups based on their ages, to ensure that everyone stood a fair chance with the games. The young leaders/animators were very good and enthusiastic and were an inspiration. They often played a song about Albania sung by Gzim Nika and also a few Portugese pop songs by the famous young Brazilian singer Michel Telo, whose songs have become famous at carnivals, not just in Brazil, but also in Europe. We were very impressed by the dancing abilities of the young animators. We often thought of our own young people in our two parishes back home and wished they could meet these inspiring youngsters.

Day 4: Tuesday 31st

The sisters and Fr Anton both gave reflections. Fr. Anton's reflection was translated back to the children in their own language once we were in our groups. Following this we organized various games relative to age, in different parts of the field, which we had previously divided into sections according to the space needed for each game.
