Everyone should have a fundamental Human Right to freedom of speech. Each of us has a voice and the choice to use it. The choices we make in the words and language we use every day contribute to creating a fair and safe society. Holocaust Memorial Day reminds us however that voices continue to be ignored or silenced. Long after the Holocaust of the Nazi regime, genocide took place in Cambodia, Rwanda, Armenia, Bosnia and Darfur. And there are countless current examples of people who need our voice: refugees, the poor, the disabled, those with learning difficulties, carers, trafficked people caught in the sex trade or domestic servitude...


