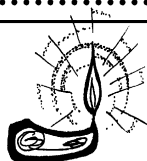

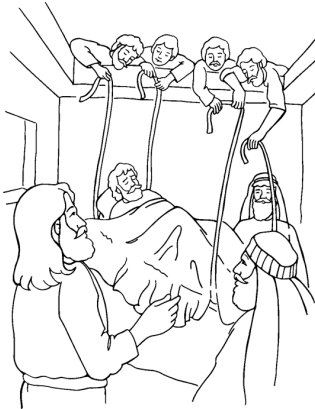


Rosary at St. Aidan's

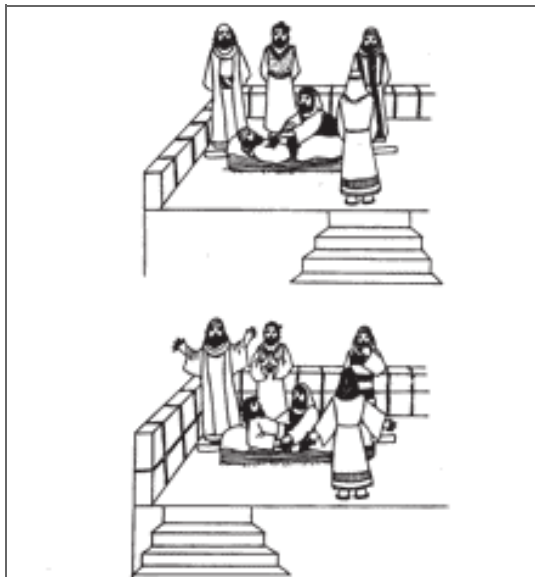
The Rosary will be prayed on the 1st Sunday of the month at 4pm in St. Aidan's. All are welcome.

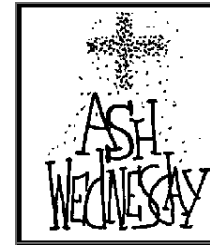


We have friends who need to come to Jesus. It may not be easy, but if each of us do our part, together we can succeed. We may meet obstacles, but we must never give up.
