Namaste

'When John uses the words "the world" he does not mean nature or creation; he means "the system" - as humans invariably construct it - which is all about security, status, pleasure and power. These are not bad as such, but they are only limited goods, and many people let them become absolute goods. Today we hear Jesus pray that we be "in the world but not of the world," that we compassionately accept the strange way we humans choose to operate and be willing to work inside it, but never really buy into it. If we are to be "in the world but not of the world," we must be ready to waste time, so to speak, in prayer. 'Wasting' time in prayer means being ready to sit still in the presence of God, allowing His presence to seep into us and quietly challenge us. It is through prayer that we slowly recognise this same world as pervaded with heaven. [1]

James Finley describes this quiet time as a 'daily rendezvous with God, with no agenda but love.' In those moments we experience the 'oneness' that Jesus prays for us. 'Oneness is less a goal toward which life is pressing, as it is a return to the truth in which we have always been held.' [2] 'We are *already* one. But we imagine that we are not. What we have to recover is our original unity. What we have to be is what we are.' [3] 'We are *already* one with everything. All that is absent is awareness. Awareness allows us to know this reality, and our openness to the Spirit within us allows this awareness to become transformational.' [3]

'Transformation comes by realising our union with God right here, right now, regardless of any performance or achievement on our part. A heart transformed by this realisation of oneness, of being 'oned' in God, knows that only love 'in here,' in me, can spot and enjoy love 'out there.' To each person – and to everything created - we can bow and say, 'Namaste. The divinity in me salutes the divinity in you.' [1]

Everyone needs to be aware that due to new EU Regulations the inception date on all passports needs to be checked as passports which have a life of more than ten years may not be valid. Your passport needs to be valid for at least six months on your return.
