We are the Beloved Sons and Daughters of God

On Monday we celebrated the feast of the Baptism of Jesus and the gospel reading for that day tells us that "As soon as Jesus was baptised, the heavens opened and a voice came from heaven: "This is my Son, the Beloved; my favour rests on him."

(Matthew 3: 17) In today's reading, John the Baptist tells us that a voice spoke to him saying: "The man on whom you see the Spirit come down and rest is the one who is going to baptise with the Holy Spirit" (John 1:29-34)

"Baptism is the initiation rite for the Christian religion and it became so from the very beginning because of Jesus himself submitting to it. The first Baptism is of water. The second Baptism which Jesus is going to give is with the Holy Spirit and Fire. It is the moment of conscious awareness, of conscious choice, of saying, "This is how I want to live my life." It is a moment of realisation that God is real, that God is with me, that God is in me, that God is for me and now I want to be for this One who is first of all for me. The Baptism of the Spirit is that moment when you 'get it', when you get your life's purpose, when you get your meaning, when you experience who you really are. It is the moment of realisation, of enlightenment. It is the moment when you really hear the words that every human being longs to hear and needs to hear. 'This is my beloved....'

You can't start the spiritual journey on a negative foundation. If you seek God only out of fear, guilt or shame, you won't go very far. If you start negative, you stay negative. You have to begin positive, by a wonderful experience, by something that's larger than life, by something that dips you into the depths of your own being. Baptism means to be 'dipped into something'.

If you have never had anyone believe in you, take delight in you, affirm you and call you 'beloved', you don't have anywhere to begin. So you keep telling yourself, "I'm great, I'm OK, I'm wonderful." But you don't believe it. The word always has to come from someone greater than you. That's what mothers and fathers are for. That's their only real job description: to communicate to their children that they are the eternally beloved children of God, that they are inherently good, that they are inherently important.

Until you know that you are beloved, you don't have anything to say, you have no good news for the world. Until that happens, you don't know who you are. Who you are is who you are from all eternity: who you are in the eyes of God and who you will forever be. The only purpose of the Gospel, and the only purpose of all church services, is to tell you that one and eternal truth. Once you get that straight, nothing can stop you. Nobody can take it away from you because no one else can give it to you except the voice of God. All you need to do is to believe that you are the beloved sons and daughters of God."
