Rooted in the True Vine

Before trying to understand today's reading, perhaps we should reflect on John 15: 5 "I am the vine, you are the branches. He who abides in Me, and I in him, bears much *fruit*; for without Me you can do nothing." That 'abiding' deepens our awareness that "the kingdom of God is within us" (Luke 17:21) and the greater our awareness of God-within-us, the more open we will be to God within the people he sends into our lives. When we are rooted in the True Vine our lives will produce His fruits of love, intimacy, mercy and forgiveness, justice, generosity, compassion, presence, wisdom, truth, healing, reconciliation, self-surrender, joy, thanksgiving, peace, obedience, humility. When these fruits are not evident in our lives then we are living apart from the Vine, we are excluding ourselves from the kingdom of God within us.

"That's the truth with which Jesus confronted the Pharisees. It's the same truth with which Jesus confronts us. How does that happen? What does self-exclusion look like? Is it when:

We struggle with perfectionism, self-condemnation, and the question of whether we're good enough?

We feel like we have to be in control, be right, have all the answers? We carry grudges, anger, resentment?

We look at others and begin making judgments about their belief, choices, or lifestyle?

We refuse to do the work of reconciliation and heal relationships?

We go through life on auto-pilot, going through the motions but never really being present, never showing up?

We are hanging onto some old guilt that we believe could not be forgiven? in our lives is there more criticism and cynicism than thanksgiving and celebration?

The antidote to our self-exclusion from the kingdom of God within us begins with first acknowledging our self-exclusion. Today's reading is not so much a parable of condemnation as it is a parable of Jesus' unwillingness to give up. His unwillingness to give up on us often confronts us with truth about our lives that is almost always difficult to hear and accept. This parable is not to condemn us but to recover us from the places of our self-exclusion, to call us back to life, and to lead us home."
