The Empty Tomb

For all three liturgical cycles the Gospel reading for Easter Sunday invites us to the empty tomb where we find linen cloths abandoned on the floor and another carefully rolled up (some translations say folded) in a separate place.



Mary, Peter and John are traumatised, confused and frightened and no doubt feel as empty as the tomb in which they stand. So if we do not feel the joy that we think we are expected to feel on Easter Sunday, then we are in good company.

Father Chrystian Shankar gives an example of one of the various attempts to explain the meaning of the linen cloths. 'The rolling up and

placement of this cloth hearkened to a Jewish custom of the time and is related to a common practice used by servants and masters. A servant, after he had prepared the dining table for his master, would stand to the side, out of sight of the master, but attentive. He wouldn't dare to return to the table until the master had finished his meal. When he was finished, he would rise, clean his fingers, mouth, and beard, and leave the 'napkin' crumpled in a ball on the table. The wrinkled, discarded napkin indicated "I have finished." If, however, for whatever reason, the master left the table with the intention of returning, then he would crease the napkin into folds and leave it beside his dishes. This was a message for the servant that he was not to disturb the table, because he, the master had indicated: "I am returning."

The imagery of this story and the artist's visual image of the empty tomb are both 'at the service of the 'unsayable'. And when we speak of emptiness, we are not speaking of *just* emptiness, but of emptiness that is beginning to be filled with a Presence.' [1] In our 'empty tomb' experiences we trust that God has not left us, and we experience this when we stand in awe and wonder as John did at the open tomb, believing that we are in the presence of a profound life-altering mystery. Opening our hearts to that mystery, we allow it to transform us from within.' [2]

Then we will experience deep Easter joy.
