# CARJ CATHOLIC ASSOCIATION FOR RACIAL JUSTICE

CARJ (Catholic association for racial justice) is an independent charity, established in 1984 in London. CARJ works to support people from diverse backgrounds. CARJ campaigns for awareness raising, and education for racial justice.

We are blessed to have a CARJ group here in our parish which is at the moment the only parish based CARJ group in the Archdiocese of Liverpool.

We all have a role to play in promoting racial justice. We need to look to our young people to help bring about change and acceptance as we simplify the love of God through them.

#### SOME FACTS TO PONDER!

86% of refugees are hosted in developing countries.

73% of refugees live in countries neighbouring their own.

**Turkey, Columbia and Pakistan** are the 3 countries that host the most refugees.

According to the EU reception of Asylum Seekers the UK came 17<sup>th</sup> in relation to intake per head of population in 2020.

The UK's share of new asylum applications in 2020 equated to about <u>7% of the total</u> applications across the EU.

The UK's population is made up of **LESS than 1% of asylum** seekers and refugees.

In the year ending September 2021, the top five countries of nationality for asylum applications (from main applicants) were: Albania (13,650), Iran (9,652), Afghanistan (6,644) Iraq (6,333) and Syria (4,143)

# Lose your self. Find your Self.

'Could human life's central task be a matter of consciously discovering and becoming who we already are and what we somehow unconsciously know?

Many spiritual writers speak of the false self and the True Self. The false self is our psychological creation of our self in space and time. It comes from our early conditioning, family, roles, education, mind, culture and religion. The false self is not bad. It's simply not the True Self. The false self is who we think we are. But thinking doesn't make it so. The false self dies and passes away. Yet it is the raw material through which we discover our True Self in God. And who we are in God is who we are and who we are in God will live forever.[1]

James Finley uses the following poetic image to illustrate the false self. 'Imagine you're standing, looking at yourself before a full-length mirror and imagine this full-length image of yourself has thought through a lot of things, and thinks it's now time to launch out on its own, that it no longer needs you. You try to explain to the image as gently as possible that this won't work because it's an image of you, so it's not going to go well for it without you. But the image just thinks you're trying to hold it back. To demonstrate your point to the image, you step halfway off the edge of the mirror and half the image disappears. It has a panic attack and thinks "I'm not real. I'm not real." Now the image is real, it just isn't real in the way it thought that it was real.' Meister Eckhart tells us that "to be real in the fullest possible sense is to be the infinity of reality itself." If we define or understand reality in this sense, then only God is real.' In an act of infinite, loving generosity, God shares with us the fullness of the mystery of infinite reality as our very reality.' [2]

In the story of the Velveteen Rabbit, the wisest and oldest toy in the nursery, the Skin Horse, tells the rabbit about toys being made Real by the love of children: "When a child loves you for a long, long time, not just to play with, but REALLY loves you, then you become Real." [3]

'Following Jesus is living from our true self, our real self; living from a loving connection and communion with God, with everyone, with everything.' [1]


