

Mass Intentions

Saturday was the last day of the summer camp, so our group organized a sports day to coincide with the Olympics. Having divided the children into 4 groups we then proceeded with an egg and spoon race; sack race; three-legged race; skipping race plus a water game in which balloons were filled with water and passed by each child over its head trying not to spill the water. This created much fun and laughter.

On Sunday the parish priest requested that Fr. Anton celebrate Mass for the villagers and this was translated into Romanian by one of the teenagers as before. It is customary for the Lord's Prayer (Our Father) to be recited in Romanian, Hungarian and German and on this occasion also in English! Due to a power cut we were forced to use Fr. Anton's phone to provide the music to accompany our singing. We managed pretty well under the circumstances. It was pleasant also, to hear the harmonious singing in Romanian which far outshone our own poor efforts. We were also invited to the local annual folkfair/festival. This usually coincides with the feast of the Assumption which is a public holiday in Romania. The festival was held by a lake within the forest, where a stage had been erected. Those taking part wore national costume and performed their traditional dances. There were also a number of stalls selling traditional food and crafts.

We departed the following day (Monday) for Budapest Airport. While waiting for our vehicle to arrive, one of the men from the village bought each of us and ice-cream but refused our offers to pay. A number of children and villagers came to say "Goodbye"- some were quite emotional. We left Budapest Airport tired but enriched by the life- giving experience of our parish project.

'Parishes of St Agnes and St Aidan'. On the following morning, the children were there by 9am. We taught them some simple exercises to music to help "wake them up". As an introduction we formed a circle ,together with the children, and took turns throwing a ball to one another, at the same time calling out one's own name, in order for everyone to get to know each other more quickly. We were fortunate in having two teenagers from Satu Mare (suggested to us by Bro. Iosif who is studying to be a Jesuit priest.) whose English was good enough for them to translate our instructions to the children. This, of course, was essential. The children were very responsive and eager to join in all the activities we had prepared for them. Each day, they were really happy to receive "prizes" which were part of the donations given by parishioners back home. At lunch time we provided sandwiches and cold drinks. Even though the children would have liked to have stayed longer each day, the exceptionally hot weather and our own exhaustion forced us to close the camp at 12.30pm everyday.

During the afternoons we took time to plan for the next day's events, prepare our own cooking needs and then mingle with the locals as it was important for us all to get to know one another and the differences in our two cultures. One or two of the local families invited our group into their homes to share their hospitality with us. We were all made to feel most welcome. It was on one of these visits, we were presented with several cloths which had been hand-embroidered and edged in lace by the elderly mother of the family. It is our intention to raffle each of the cloths and to send the proceeds to Romania to help with the school projects.

On another occasion we travelled to a neighbouring village to visit a particular gypsy family known to Fr. Anton from a previous visit. It was a shock to most of the group to witness the extremely poor conditions under which this family of 8 children (soon to be 9) and their parents, were coping in just one small, dark and dingy room. That evening, during our time of prayer and reflection some group members shared their thoughts and emotions following the visit made earlier in the day.

Romania- Summer camp 2012


The Missioning Mass for the nine people travelling to Romania for the summer camp, took place on Sunday the 20th of August, at. St. Aidan's church a few hours before our departure.

In order for us to reach Homorodu de Jos, in Romania we needed to take a flight to Budapest in Hungary, after which, we faced a four hour journey by road. Before leaving Hungary we picked up a few days supply of groceries from the local Tesco store! (Yes they have them there too). After several delays we finally arrived in the village just before sunrise- around 5am. It was already quite hot and the whole village was still asleep.

Our accommodation was in the Pearl House care home owned by Caritas. During our stay the clients who use this facility were home for the summer with their families. After unpacking some personal items, we managed to get a few hours sleep, several people sharing rooms, where necessary.

The first morning began by visiting the school. We were greeted by a few of the teachers and local villagers, some of whom asked about members of our previous group who visited on the last trip to Romania. It was good to know that they still remembered us.

We spent our time that morning in getting to know the children, settling into the house; discussing menus and sorting out a "kitty" to help with budgeting. By the afternoon we were all quite tired and decided to take a "siesta". Later that night we had prayers and reflections, then began sorting through the boxes containing the many generous donations sent over by our parishioners. Several of these gifts were bought using the ASDA receipts. Some of the clothing we donated was given to the school , as we learned that there were children unable to attend lessons because they had very few clothes of their own to wear. We also gave the school two used laptops donated by Virgin Media. It was interesting to see how the money we supplied on our two previous visits had been put to good use. This had provided much-needed toilets for both staff and pupils and a new floor for one of the classrooms.


