Mystery is endlessly understandable

In today's gospel passage there is not a single quality of Mary that is named. Nothing. It doesn't say she was worthy, smart, good looking, filled with virtue. Not a single virtue is named. Instead, we hear her say, "He has looked upon his servant in her lowliness." God has loved her in her nothingness, in her littleness. Mary found favour with God. Now 'favour' doesn't say anything about the one who is favoured. It says something about the one who is doing the favouring. In Greek, the word we translate as 'favoured' means undeserved love, unmerited, totally free from the giver's side. We all know that it is very hard to receive an undeserved gift. We all want to prove that we earned it, that we're worthy of it, that we're smart or holy enough. Mary doesn't go there. She makes no claims to deserving this gift. Every other encounter in the Bible when an angel enters the scene and gives an announcement, the person argues about their worthiness. Mary doesn't. She simply accepts that God can do what God can do. She could not possibly have understood what was really happening. Somehow she becomes the receptacle that brings the Christ into the world.

That's the pattern everywhere, all the time for us too. We're not worthy either. We have no credits to our name. Yet it is into this nothingness that we are, that the Christ forever comes. It boggles the mind; it explodes the heart to imagine how this could be true. And the word to us, as it was to Mary, is: "Don't be afraid. You have found favour with God." In our world of computation and calculation, we cannot understand total, undeserved love.

We usually use the word 'mystery' as meaning something that we will never understand. But that is not the traditional or true meaning of the word. Mystery is not something that we cannot understand, but something that is *endlessly understandable!* It is multilayered and pregnant with meaning and never totally admits to closure or resolution.

Car Parking


Please pay attention to parking on the streets during Mass. Often cars are parked which makes it impossible for wheelchair users and prams to pass safely on the pavement.

New First Communion Programme Details

There will no longer be an evening preparation session. In order to prepare for First Communion, we are asking the children to attend *Sunday Mass from 4th February to the First Communions in June*, where the Preparation Book will be distributed and worked through alongside catechists in Little Church. This offers the best opportunity for your child to have full understanding of this very special sacrament.

It is **essential** that your child attend the day of preparation which will be arranged for each school. For those who do not attend St Aidan's, St. Joseph's or St. Anne's, there will be a separate day of preparation advertised through the parish newsletter in the new year.

In order to participate in the First Communion Programme, your child MUST be baptised. We will have to have their name, date of birth and date of baptism before they start in February. If you are not sure of their baptism date, please phone the Parish office of the church where they were baptised to confirm. Please complete an application form (can be found at the back of both churches and will be given to schools after half term) and hand into the *Parish Office:* 92 Adswood Road, Huyton, L36 7XR.

We cannot confirm dates as yet, but the proposed month for First Communions is June 2018.

WCMAD (SURINAME AND ROMANIA)

On behalf of the parish family as we come to the end of this year, we are grateful to all those who have supported us in many different ways and continue to support our parish missions in Suriname and Romania. As you are aware, we continue to financially support Fr Toon's work in the Amazon rainforest (Suriname) especially in training the lay leaders in the 32 church communities. They are grateful to all the work our parishioners have done during their visits in building and renovating their church/community centres and helping with the sanitary facilities in Apoera and Washabo villages. Our contributions have made a huge difference in spreading the good news mainly among the Maroon (formerly known as "bush" negroes) and Arawak (native Indians) people. Please continue to remember Fr Toon and Sr Egno in your prayers.

Romania (Romanian Project moving to a new location)

The parish will be sending out a group to Romania again in July 2018. The village of Homorodu du Jos, where the group have worked with the summer camp for the last six years, has gone from strength to strength. Quite a number of the families now have work and, generally, the poverty level has lifted. This year it was the consensus of the group that it was probably time to move on as we felt the original need had been fulfilled. We have now made a new connection with Caritas in Petrosani (in the south west of Romania) with the help of Sr Silvia who is a member of The Helpers of the Holy Souls (the congregation to whom Srs Elizabeth and MaryRose belong). Petrosani is a former mining town but after the fall of the communist regime, many mines were closed. Petroşani is one of the Romanian cities which has experienced the fastest population loss from the 1990s onwards.

Our parishioners will be involved in various types of voluntary jobs while in Petrosani. These will involve manual work (painting the house, fence, playground, etc) and they will also be helping with the children in the Maria Stein centre. Our parish volunteers have been preparing for this new challenge during their monthly meetings and 12 of them will embark on this project on 21 July 2018. As we thank you for your support please continue to remember them in your prayers.



SHARe Knowsley News Update

SHARe Knowsley wants to extend its sincerest thanks for all the support you have given to us these past two years. From when we started out with the trip to Calais to our present day, where we have a weekly drop-in, your ongoing donations have provided the backbone for what we do. To date, over the past two years you have donated an AMAZING £7866.54. WOW!! A HUGE THANK YOU TO EVERYONE FOR ALL YOUR SUPPORT! Without this money, we would not be able to do what we do. I think our parish certainly embraced the call from Pope Francis to 'welcome the stranger in our midst.'

So what have we been spending your money on?

As asylum seekers only receive £5 a day per person to live on, we are committed to refunding any transport costs incurred in getting to the weekly drop-in, as we believe that it is important that everyone should be able to access our services freely. At the drop-in, we welcome people with a free lunch, tea and coffee and a big smile. We also purchase a selection of fresh fruit and other foodstuffs as well as nappies and baby milk which we sell for nominal amounts as well as selling second hand clothing and toiletries to try and ensure that basic needs are met. We are currently spending between £180 and £200 each week on transport refunds and the purchase of the items we sell. When people receive refugee status there is often an interim period where they have no money at all, so we then provide an emergency payment of £10 per person per week. This has proved invaluable to those who have found themselves in such an awful situation. And of course, when we can't find items for free, we purchase basic items that are needed to help them set up their new homes.

In addition to the weekly drop-in, we also organise social events, which are enjoyed by both service users and volunteers alike and enables a wonderful sharing of various cultures. We have people from a range of countries including Iran, Syria, Iraq, Albania, Nigeria, Eritrea, Ethiopia, Libya, Yemen, Tunisia and Sudan.

The Christmas party on 9th December was a huge success . Thank you to all those who joined in.

SHARe Knowsley is staffed entirely by volunteers and we are reliant wholly on the generosity of donations to do the work we do. Since we started the drop-in in June 2016, with YOUR HELP we have supported a total of 66 adults and 38 children. I am in a very privileged position to see the difference we really do make to people's lives. Men's Rites of Passage

A 5-day life-changing program for men devised by Richard Rohr OFM which has been undertaken by over 5000 men across the world.

This is not about religion, but about spirituality. About age-old traditions that guide men into manhood. About coming to trust that there is something much greater at work in your life than you could ever imagine. Taking you sometimes OUT of your comfort zones, but more deeply back into your own life. You may find yourself mentally, intellectually, emotionally or spiritually challenged. This is part of the experience for some men: it may feel risky or uncomfortable; you may not always feel in control. Throughout the 5 days you will be held by an experienced team of male elders who have all previously undertaken the Rites themselves. As the Elders take you through the process of the Rites you will experience drumming, ritual, fire, silence, small groups, wilderness, solo-time, teaching . . . and more.

The Men's Rites of Passage are suitable for men of all colour, age, sexuality, ethnicity and faith tradition (or no faith); men with more severe physical disabilities are asked to provide more details of their restrictions during the application process and we will provide further advice.
