

Church security is everybody's responsibility

May I ask all those who go for walks in the area to spend a few minutes checking around the church grounds and report any vandalism or anti-social behaviour. We need to be alert to any people loitering around the property. We appreciate everyone looking out for our church property. Many Thanks, Fr. Anton There are three Greek words for *life* used in the New Testament: **bios**, **psuche** and **zoe**. **Bios** refers to the life of the physical body. The English word *biology* comes from *bios*. The Greek word translated as *soul-life* is *psuche*. The English word *psychology* comes from *psuche*. **Zoe** refers to the uncreated, eternal life of God, the divine life uniquely possessed by God. [1]

In today's Gospel reading the words 'life' or 'live' or 'living' appear ten times and each time a derivation of the word **Zoe** is used. 'Jesus is talking about that life which is beyond words, indescribable, and yet we know it when we taste it. We get a taste of it when we love so deeply and profoundly and somehow we are more fully alive than ever before. Sometimes everything seems to fit together perfectly and all is right with the world; not because we got our way but because we knew our self to be a part of something larger, more beautiful, and more holy than anything we could have done. We were tasting life. In those moments time seems to stand still and we wish the moment would never end. It tastes so good.' [2]

'During the bombing raids of World War II, thousands of children were orphaned and left to starve. The fortunate ones were rescued and placed in refugee camps where they received food and good care. But many of these children who had lost so much could not sleep at night. They feared waking up to find themselves once more homeless and without food. Nothing seemed to reassure them. Finally, someone hit upon the idea of giving each child a piece of bread to hold at bedtime. Holding their bread, these children could finally sleep in peace. All through the night the bread reminded them, "Today I ate and I will eat again tomorrow." [3]

The gospel tells us that if we hold on to Jesus, if we choose to be nourished by his whole way of life, his teaching and his attitudes, then we will continue to grow in awareness that he lives in us and we live in Him. Every day we will be nourished by this life-giving bread and no matter what our life circumstances, we will know we will be fed again tomorrow and tomorrow...
