

Tradition Versus Tradition

'Tradition with a capital 'T' refers to the perennial Tradition which points to recurring themes and truths within all of the world's religions. At their most mature level, religions cultivate in their followers a deeper union with God, with each other and with reality. St. Thomas Aquinas (1225–1274) held that if it's true, it's from the Holy Spirit. And if it's from the Holy Spirit, it's going to keep being discovered again and again. Tradition with a small 't' are those practices in all aspects of our lives which acquire an importance they do not deserve; some of these practices can cease to be life-giving, simply because we can't bear to change the way we've always done things. The Perennial Wisdom Tradition tells us not to settle for anything less than the truth of our Christ-self, the self that is already one with the Divine and with all that is.' [1]

'In today's Gospel, Jesus comes into conflict with the Pharisees who had a great regard for what is referred to as 'the tradition of the elders,' traditions which had been passed down orally for hundreds of years and that applied the Jewish Law to all the details of daily living. These traditions were not written in the Scriptures but they had come to acquire an authority that was equal to that of the Scriptures.' [2] 'A Perennial Wisdom teacher is always looking for our 'stuck' point. What is it that is preventing our growth?' [3] Jesus tells us that the 'stuck point' for the Pharisees was that 'they looked at the external activity whereas Jesus looked at the heart, the source of activity. They looked to the fulfilment of law and tradition while he looked to love and commitment. They looked at the letter of the law while he looked at its spirit.' [4]

'How can we discern whether we follow a life-giving Tradition? Jesus tells us to notice what comes out from within us, what fruit our adherence to Tradition bears. Does our understanding of Tradition lead to hospitality, to inclusion and to freedom? Does it cause our heart to open wide with compassion? Does it lead other people to feel loved and welcomed at God's table? Does it make us brave, creative and joyful? '[5] 'Does it give us the courage to cease doing our own kind of survival dance and choose instead our sacred dance?' [1]
