

We have now set a date for our parish pilgrimage to the Holy Land. This will take place from the **2nd April**, **2018** for eight nights. Don't Worry

There are times in our lives when our life situation is so overwhelming that the last thing we want anyone to say to us is, "Don't worry" even if that person is Jesus!

Eckhart Tolle differentiates between our <u>life situation</u> and <u>our life</u>. "There is something within you that remains unaffected by the transient circumstance of your <u>life situation</u>, and only through surrender do you have access to it. It is <u>your life</u>, your very Being. Illness/disability/loss etc are part of your <u>life situation</u>. As such, it has a past and a future. Underneath the various conditions that make up *your life situation* – which exists in time - there is something deeper, more essential: *your Life*, your very Being in the timeless Now. The condition that is labelled 'illness', has nothing to do with who you truly are.

It may look as if the situation is creating suffering, but ultimately, this is not so — your resistance is. The pain that you create now is always some form of non-acceptance, some form of conscious resistance to what is. Surrender is the simple but profound wisdom of yielding to, rather than opposing the flow of life. The only place where you can experience the flow of life is the Now, so to surrender is to accept the present moment unconditionally and without reservation. Surrender is to relinquish inner resistance to what is. When we offer no resistance to life, we are no longer dependent upon things being in a certain way, good or bad.

Don't look for peace. Anything you accept fully will get you there, will take you into peace. This is the miracle of surrender. When you accept what is, every moment is the best moment. That is enlightenment.

Your inner peace does not depend on any situation. You abide in Being – unchanging, timeless, deathless –and you are no longer dependent for fulfilment or happiness on the outer world of constantly fluctuating forms.

You become like a deep lake. The outward situation of your life, whatever happens there, is the surface of the lake: sometimes calm, sometimes windy and rough, according to the cycles and seasons. Deep down, however, the lake is always undisturbed. You are the whole lake, not just the surface and you are in touch with your own depth which remains absolutely still.

Watch any plant or animal and let it teach you acceptance of what is, and how to surrender to the Now. Let it teach you Being."
