Christ, Our Nourishment

'When God asked Moses to bring the Israelites out of Egypt, Moses knew they would ask him for the name of the one who sent him. "What shall I tell them?" he asked. God said to Moses, "This is what you are to say to the Israelites: 'I AM has sent me to you.'" [cf Exodus 3: 1-14] 'I AM' is God's own name, which Jesus applies to himself. 'In St John's gospel, Jesus used the words "I AM" in seven declarations about Himself. Seven is the symbolic number of wholeness and perfection. St Augustine reminds us that our hearts are restless until they rest in God. That restlessness comes from a sense of being incomplete which arises when we have looked in the wrong places for enlightenment, direction, leadership, life, community and truth; when we have looked in the wrong places for nourishment. During the past few Sundays we have been reading about how the crowds followed Jesus for nourishment, for their perception of what would satisfy their hunger. 'When Jesus says, "I am the Bread of Life," he is not talking primarily here of the Eucharist, of Holy Communion. Rather, Jesus is saying that he, his whole way of life, his teaching, his attitudes and relationships towards his Father and people, everything that the Gospel tells us about him is real food for our daily living. Not to know and assimilate Jesus in this way is to be starved of the essential nourishment we need in order to live a full life. To eat that bread is to have one's whole life permeated with the spirit of Jesus. That is eternal life. Such a person is fully alive – now and forever. We eat that bread by absorbing into ourselves the spirit, the truth and integrity, the love and compassion, the generosity and peacefulness of Jesus.' [2]

When we choose a lifestyle that enables us to find nourishment in Christ's presence in every aspect of our lives, we will become more aware that we have his life within us and our being will be rooted in Christ and we will live fully wherever we are, in whatever we do. [3]
