Experiencing the Mystery of the Trinity

'The mystery of the Trinity is the most fundamental of our faith. On it everything else depends and from it everything else derives.' [1] 'We must be willing to admit that, should the doctrine of the Trinity be discarded, the major part of religious literature could well remain virtually unchanged.' [2] Which of the above two statements do we relate to?

The Church expresses her Trinitarian faith by professing a belief in the oneness of God in whom there are three Persons: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. 'When we talk about one and three in terms of the Trinity it's helpful to remember that we're not talking about the numeric 1 and the numeric 3. When we say God is one, we mean oneness. When we say God is three, we are talking about 'manyness', dynamism, movement, relationship, intimacy. To say God is one and three, is to say God is oneness and 'manyness' all at the same time, holding all things together.' [3]

'We have framed the doctrine/teaching on the Trinity as a belief rather than as an experience. The first wave of Christians were all Jews and had a deep experience of God as Creator, as Source, as Transcendent, a sense of God beyond. Then they came to have the powerful experience of God embodied in a human life, the experience of God-among-us, God in the holy other. This didn't end with their experience of Jesus but it continued in the Christian community. Then on Pentecost they experienced God deeply within them as that fire which drove them out to share the good news.' [3]

'When Jesus prays that we will experience eternal life, he is inviting us to this amazing experience of being one with God beyond us, as transcendent; with God among us, incarnate in human life, in creation; and with God within us as the Holy Spirit poured into our hearts. Here we have an understanding of the Trinity that moves out of abstract doctrine into intimate experience.' [3]

'The deepest and most profound truths of our lives are not provable facts. They are those which offer experiences and meaning, not explanations and understanding. The Feast of the Holy Trinity is not about a doctrine, ideas, or concepts. It is a feast of life, a feast of mystery that invites human beings to participate in God's life. [4]
