

I Am the Gate

When we reflect on Jesus as the Good Shepherd, we have a cornucopia of themes on which to feast: loving; following; listening; being known; pastoring; nourishing; giving life; gentle caring; being lost and found. Each theme is a meal in itself, nourishing us as we reflect on its relevance in our own lives. In today's second reading Peter speaks about Jesus' response to suffering, especially undeserved suffering, leaving an example for us so that we can 'return to our Shepherd'.

"When we suffer, everything in us wants to blame somebody. We may feel that it releases our anger, but it doesn't really heal. Many studies have shown that most of the pain that we suffer is not from the incident itself, but it's our resistance to it. It's that constant voice that shouts, "This isn't fair. This shouldn't have happened to me. This is not right." Although these reactions may be justified, the trouble is that they destroy the soul, because we keep replaying those voices over and over again. Jesus shepherds the soul by walking through the gate first and then he says, "I am the gate." Life isn't fair and if we expect it always to be fair, we are going to live every day angry, bitter and disappointed. It's said that every expectation is a resentment waiting to happen. The way Jesus shepherds our soul is by leading us to a much deeper place where we don't immediately fight, resist and oppose everything that happens to us. I offer you the following prayer. When we first read it, we will probably think, "This is impossible. I can't do that." But when we can, we will find the grace to say 'Yes' to life before we start with 'No'. Most of us start the day with 'No. I don't like it; I resist it; I have to fix it, change it or even understand it' – when most of the time we can't. I offer this prayer, not because I know how to live it but because Jesus did it first and he will show us the way. (adapted from Richard Rohr)

Welcome, welcome, welcome. I welcome everything that comes to me today because I know it's for my healing. I welcome all thoughts, feelings, emotions, persons, situations, and conditions. I let go of my desire for power and control. I let go of my desire for affection, esteem, approval and pleasure. I let go of my desire for survival and security. I let go of my desire to change any situation, condition, person or even myself. I simply open to the love and presence of God and God's action within. Amen.

Parish Funding During the Corornavirus Lockdown

It is always difficult to broach the subject of financial matters but having discussed with those directly involved in the parish finance and with the advice from the Archdiocese to the parishes, we feel we need to explain the financial situation to all our parishioners during this current crisis. We have had a number of enquiries as to how parishioners can continue to support the parish financially while there are no Masses and therefore no collections.

A portion of the parish income comes from parishioners who have a monthly standing order in place, while a large portion of the parish income comes from the collections at Mass.

We are acutely aware that the implications of the lockdown have had far reaching consequences for many. Some people may be feeling financial hardship at present and as such, we would fully understand if they decided to temporarily suspend their monthly standing order to the parish.

With no Sunday Masses at this time of lockdown, and all churches temporarily closed, the parish will receive significantly less income. In addition, the reduction in income will materially outweigh any reduction in expenditure, resulting in an ongoing weekly deficit.

In these circumstances, we would like to invite those parishioners who normally give to the weekly collection at Sunday Mass, either in envelopes or cash, and feel able to continue to do so, to consider setting up a monthly standing order for an equivalent amount.

In the event you would feel more comfortable continuing to use your giving envelopes, we are currently arranging to safely drop these at your homes. We would ask that you keep these until the churches are open again, as we currently have no safe way of collecting and counting them.
