Holding together the contradictions within ourselves

For most of us Holy Week unfolds like many other weeks; we still contend with work, school, preparing meals, doing laundry, dealing with difficult relationships, experiencing the usual successes and setbacks. Today we are being invited to slow down so that this week doesn't go by without our taking the time to enter into its meaning, which is the ultimate meaning of our lives. [1]

Palm Sunday: Today may feel like one of confusion and contradiction. What begins as a victory parade will end as a funeral procession. There's a part of us that wants to say, "What is this week about: palms or passion?" The answer is, "Both." That's the reality of our lives. It is not about choosing between life or death, palms or passion; but about choosing life and death, palms and passion. [2]

Holy Thursday: In John's Gospel, in what's known as the Farewell Discourse (John 13:31-17:26), Jesus says the word love thirty-one times. Before saying the word, He takes a towel, a basin, water and washes the feet of his friends. He then says, "You also should do as I have done to you." As we approach the altar this week, how will we allow ourselves to receive the gift of the love that meets us there? When we leave the altar, how will we carry this love with us? How will we enact this love, giving it flesh for the life of the world? [3]

Good Friday: Today the liturgy invites us to surrender to the mystery of the cross which teaches us that the price we pay for holding together the contradictions within ourselves, others and the world is always some form of crucifixion. When we kneel at the foot of the cross Jesus teaches us how to stand against hate without becoming hate, how to oppose evil without becoming evil. [4]

Holy Saturday: This is the day between dying and rising. This day calls us to hold our anguish and our hope in the same hand. It is the day when our experience of the cross is 'holding the tension between one space and another. This is called liminal space. (The Latin root limen literally means threshold.) It is in these transitional moments of our lives that authentic transformation can happen.' [4] 'Liminal space is a place in between what we were and what we are becoming. It is like a chrysalis for humans.' [5]

As we enter into the meaning of Holy Week, we are reminded that 'we are called not just to remember Christ's life but to reproduce his life in the day-to-day events of our own, without picking and choosing what aspects of his life we wish to experience.' [6]

First Communion 2025
