# God gives God's self as the answer to our every prayer

Today's gospel reading is one of those passages that needs an explanation because if you take it as it is, it sounds as if God can be talked into things. This also seems to be the message in the first reading. [1] What can we honestly make of Jesus' teaching in this Gospel passage? What can we carry away that might still feel authentic and life-qiving? [2]

'The reading begins with a disciple approaching Jesus and asking "Lord, teach us to pray." The disciples were not ignorant or inexperienced when it comes to prayer; they were devout Jews who had most likely grown up attending Sabbath services. They knew how to pray. They were not seeking better technique. So what was it? What did they observe in Jesus when he prayed? We can't know for sure, but I'll hazard some guesses: intimacy, belonging, trust, peace and a closeness that was transformative and nourishing.' [2]

'Ask, seek, knock. What if we use possible synonyms for Jesus' famous ask-seek-knock trifecta? What about, "yearn" or hunger, or want ?'[2] We are reminded of those other words of Jesus: "Blessed are those who are beggars for the things of the spirit."

Today's first reading and the gospel reading emphasise persistence in prayer. Often our prayer is that God will change our circumstances. Sometimes that does happen. 'However, in the Gospel only one promise is made: "If you know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!" What Jesus promises us in answer to our prayers is the Holy Spirit.' [2] 'God gives God's self as the answer to our every prayer.' [1]

'There is no other promise or guarantee. It's hard to accept the Holy Spirit as God's perfect gift. The truth is, it's hard to persist in prayer and not receive the answers we're hoping for; when we'd rather receive healing for our sick loved ones, or an end to the toxicity that now pervades world politics, or some reliable hope in the face of global climate change.' [2]

'God's love protects us from nothing; but God's love sustains us in all things. We need a daily rendezvous with God, with nothing on our agenda but love. There we will be taken to the deeper place where we discover the spark of the divine that is in our hearts. If we are absolutely grounded in the absolute love of God that protects us from nothing even as it sustains us in all things, then we can face all things with courage and tenderness and touch the hurting places in others and in ourselves with love." # Remembering Anthony Walker Commemorating His Life and Legacy – July 30

On July 30, we mark the anniversary of the tragic and racially motivated attack that claimed the life of Anthony Walker in 2005 in Huyton, Liverpool. Anthony was just 18 years old - a bright, kind and ambitious young man with dreams of becoming a law-yer. His life was brutally cut short in an unprovoked attack that shocked the nation and exposed the deep wounds of racial hatred that still persist in our society.

Anthony's memory lives on through the work of the Anthony Walker Foundation, which was established by his family to tackle racism, hate crime and discrimination through education, support and community outreach. The Foundation continues to inspire change, empower young people and promote a more just and inclusive society.

As we remember Anthony, we also recommit ourselves to standing against racism in all its forms. Let this anniversary be not only a time of reflection but also a call to action - to build communities rooted in dignity, equality and peace.
