Our hearts are restless until they rest in God

'In today's gospel Jesus tells us that there are many kinds of greed. Greed deceives and convinces us that if we just have more of something then we will be more complete. For example:

- If I have more money then I will have a more secure future.
- If I can get more of your time and attention then I'll feel accepted and relevant.
- If I can gain more power and control then I'll be safe and respected. [1]

Whatever it is that we want to possess, Jesus reminds us that "Life does not consist in the abundance of possessions." That doesn't mean that possessions are inherently bad or wrong or that we shouldn't allow them to bring us pleasure. The problem is when we give our possessions the power to bring us lasting happiness. 'The pursuit of possessions as a means to happiness is often misguided. While attaining a desired possession might bring a fleeting moment of pleasure, it ultimately doesn't lead to lasting contentment and can be followed by anxiety about losing it.' [2]

'Everything we possess and long to possess is infinitely less than what will put to rest the restlessness of our heart. St. Augustine said, "You made our hearts for you oh Lord and our hearts are restless until they rest in you." God created us this way. God made our hearts in such a way that nothing less than the infinity of God will ever be enough for us. It's an arranged situation. It's a setup. Thomas Merton once said, "Anytime I want something very, very badly and I finally get it, it burns me. It's just one more thing that's infinitely not enough for me." But in the 'not-enoughness' of everything, we can see the divinity of everything.' [3] The true love of our loved ones and the life-giving pleasures of our possessions are manifestations of God's infinite love.

'Ultimately greed is a symptom or pointer to a deeper issue. Greed is really just a way of dealing with our own feelings of deficit and emptiness. It's not so much about *having* enough but about *being* enough. When we believe ourselves to be deficient, when we lose belief in ourselves, when we feel we are not enough, then we get greedy. We use things and other people to fill the hole inside us.' [1] That 'hole', which is the restlessness we experience, is not an indication that something is wrong with us; it is 'the bottomless abyss of God's love which is infinitely more than the sum total of all we can possess. Falling into the abyss of God's love – falling in Love – will always lead to *letting go* of 'possessions' which prevent us from experiencing the infinite love that is transforming us into itself - which is our destiny.'[3]
