### ***Do we respond or react?***

'It is worth noting that today's gospel passage begins by Jesus saying: *I say to you who hear*. In some translations, Jesus' words are: *I say to you who are listening*. In order to understand what Jesus is really saying to us, we have to put aside our prejudices and assumptions and really listen to what he is saying. This passage, in particular, is one where we are likely to react emotionally.' [1]

'Victor Frankl was a Jewish psychiatrist from Vienna who was imprisoned in a Nazi death camp. He wrote about the last of human freedoms as being the ability 'to choose one's attitude to a given set of circumstances'. In that situation of terrible confinement, almost every human freedom had been taken away, but not that final freedom, the freedom to choose one's attitude to that degrading situation. It was this final freedom which, Frankl said, helped himself and others to survive even the most inhuman of situations. To love and not to hate; to bless and not to curse; to be merciful and not to be bitter - the choice is always there. There is a difference between reacting to something and responding to it. The easiest thing in the world is to react. Reaction is automatic, but responding takes thought and strength and control. We find an example of this in the first reading. Abishai **reacted** by wanting to kill Saul on the spot, whereas David **responded**, recognising that Saul was the Lord's anointed as the legitimate king of Israel. **Reacting** almost bypasses choice, whereas we have to choose how to **respond**. Choosing to respond in a loving way to someone who hates us is the ultimate expression of Christian freedom, the freedom of the Spirit.' [2]

'This final freedom to choose to love those who have given us no reason to love them is rooted in a deeply rooted faith in God's unconditional love for all of humanity.' [2] 'The beginning of the fight against hatred, the basic Christian answer to hatred, is not the commandment to love, but what must necessarily come before in order to make the commandment bearable and comprehensible. The root of Christian love is not the will to love, but the faith that we are loved'. [3] 'God is compassionate towards each one of us. That faith conviction empowers us to be compassionate as God is compassionate.' [2]

'In order to feel compassion for other people, we have to feel compassion for ourselves. [4] When we respond to all the wounded parts of ourselves, rather than react to them, we will learn to have compassion for ourselves and then the circle of compassion for others becomes wider. Compassion is the love that recognises and goes forth to identify with the preciousness of all that is lost and broken within ourselves and others.' [5]
