Thin Places, Veils and Transfiguration

'We use the word 'immaterial' when describing something that to us is unimportant, irrelevant or insignificant. But 'immaterial' also means spiritual rather than physical. We often limit our world and our experience to the five senses and we treat the spiritual as immaterial, as unreal.' [1] P.A.

We tend to live with a veil that separates the external world of tangible, measurable, rational information from that other world, the inner world of mystery, transformation, and encounter. There are moments, however, when we stand in what the Celtic tradition calls a *thin place* where the veil is parted between this world and the other world, between heaven and earth, between the divine and the human, between matter and spirit, between the eternal and the temporal. Thin places invite us to enter the tremendous mystery of God's presence and love. We all have our personal experiences of thin places: watching a sunrise or sunset; gazing at a starlit sky; marvelling at the wonders of creation; being with a loved one in whose presence we know ourselves to be unconditionally loved. Thin places transform our lives and continue to sustain us. The veil parts and we know ourselves to be different. We and our whole world now stand in a different light. That is what happened to Peter, James, and John. Jesus led them to a thin place, a place where human ears would hear God's voice, human eyes would see divine light, and human life would be enveloped in the cloud of God's presence.

Peter, James, and John came face to face with the really Real. It was not simply an outer experience of the senses. It was rather an experience of inner transformation, one that left them silent. Instead of *talking about* what they saw and heard, they would *become* that which they encountered. We do not often talk about our experiences of thin places. Instead, like the three apostles, we keep silent, telling no one of our encounter. It is not because those encounters are not real. It is, rather, because they are too real, too real for words. Words could never describe the experience and would only diminish the mystery and greatness of that encounter. We are now different and can never go back to the way it was before.'[2] 'That moment of transfiguration now resides eternally within us, helping us to see and hear the sacred both in our mountaintop and our valley experiences. Can we hold the mountain and the valley *as one* — denying neither, and embracing both?' [3]

Help SHARE Knowsley sow seeds of Love

"Whenever I go outside, I hold my head down like a dog that no one should say anything."

The people we support are feeling the weight of hatred from some in the local community, who are judging them purely on the fact that they are not from the UK and are then subjecting them to racist abuse and assault.

Some locals are presenting the argument that they are just 'protecting their children', because they have judged all asylum seekers as being bad. Some base their judgements on seeing them acting 'shifty' or 'dodgy' when out and about. If asylum seekers are looking 'shifty' or 'dodgy' it is because they are looking over their shoulders, fearing that they will be the next to be abused or assaulted.

"They insult us, throw iron money at us and their saliva. Some hit us, It is not safe for us to go outside." "I wish these people knew my pain. Life has no value for me now. It is better for a person to die once than to be humiliated every day."

Nobody should be made to feel like this! Asylum seekers have already suffered much trauma and deserve to be treated as a fellow human being, with understanding and compassion.

We know that this is not how the majority of our local community think, so we are asking you to join us in sending cards of support and love.
