86% of refugees are hosted in developing countries

73% of refugees live in countries neighbouring their own

Turkey, Columbia and Pakistan are the 3 countries that host the most refugees

According to the EU reception of Asylum Seekers the UK came 17th in relation to intake per head of population in 2020.

The UK's share of new asylum applications in 2020 equated to about 7% of the total applications across the EU.

The UK's population is made up of <u>LESS than 1% of a</u>sylum seekers and refugees.



Men's Rites of Passage

A 5-day life-changing program for men devised by Richard Rohr OFM which has been undertaken by over 5000 men across the world.

This is not about religion, but about spirituality. About age-old traditions that guide men into manhood. About coming to trust that there is something much greater at work in your life than you could ever imagine. Taking you sometimes OUT of your comfort zones, but more deeply back into your own life. You may find yourself mentally, intellectually, emotionally or spiritually challenged. This is part of the experience for some men: it may feel risky or uncomfortable; you may not always feel in control. Throughout the 5 days you will be held by an experienced team of male elders who have all previously undertaken the Rites themselves. As the Elders take you through the process of the Rites you will experience drumming, ritual, fire, silence, small groups, wilderness, solo-time, teaching . . . and more.

The Men's Rites of Passage are suitable for men of all colour, age, sexuality, ethnicity and faith tradition (or no faith); men with more severe physical disabilities are asked to provide more details of their restrictions during the application process and we will provide further advice.

We Can Make a Difference (WCMAD) Suriname & Romania)

On behalf of the parish family as we come to the end of this year, we are grateful to all those who have supported us (WCMAD– We cam make a Difference project) in many different ways and continue to support our parish missions in Suriname and Romania.

As you are aware, we continue to financially support Fr Toon's work in the Amazon rainforest (Suriname) especially in training the lay leaders in the 32 church communities. They are grateful to all the work our parishioners have done during their visits to Suriname in building and renovating their church/community centres and helping with the sanitary facilities. Our contributions have made a huge difference in spreading the good news mainly among the Maroon (formerly known as "bush" negroes) and Arawak (native Indians) people. Please continue to remember Fr Toon in your prayers.

Romania (Petrosani)

Unfortunately, due to present circumstances, our parishioners were unable to visit Romania this year. We are still in regular contact with 'Maria Stein' day centre for children who regularly update us on the activities the children are doing. They have struggled these past months but were still able to have some contact with the children.

Romania & Suriname Projects

If your child is currently in Year 4 and you would like them to celebrate their First Communion, our applications for 2022 are now available (back of church or via school). We plan to work with the schools again this year to support the preparation programme and will let you know how that will work in the coming weeks. The dates for First Communions have yet to be arranged. These will be published as soon as possible.

The Miracle Begins when the Wine Runs Out

'The literal interpretation of Scripture is the least helpful. The symbolic level is the level filled with meaning that changes our lives. We don't know if the events in today's Gospel really happened in this way, but there are a lot of give-aways that there is a deeper message here. One of these is the focus on the six stone jars that were used for purification rites. Much of the history of religion is about ceremonial washing where the emphasis is on purification because we are not perfect enough. The jars in today's Gospel are empty. Jesus filled the jars to the brim with wine. This is not just a miracle story. It is a transformational story about what Jesus is bringing about in the history of religion. We thought that religion was about a list of requirements which we have to fulfil so that God will love us. As in so many Scripture passages, matrimonial imagery is used in today's Gospel to tell us that what God wants with humanity is a love affair, a marriage. We find it difficult to accept that God would want such an intimate relationship with us, so we keep going back to the six empty jars of purifying water, to fulfilling the law. But laws don't teach us how to love. In today's Gospel, Jesus changes the focus of religion from a religion of legalism to a religion of love, filled to the brim with joy and celebration. [1]

Today's Gospel could also be symbolic of those times when our lives seem empty and dry, when we 'have no wine.' 'Each one of us could tell a story about the day the wine gave out: stories of failure, self-doubt, regrets or disappointments; stories of loss – of a loved one or of a familiar way of life. We become increasingly aware that we cannot replenish the wine of our life from our own resources. Regardless of how it feels or what we think about it, the day the wine runs out is the beginning of a miracle. That day confronts us with a truth as old as creation itself: we are the recipients and not the creators of our life. We were never intended nor expected to live by the sufficiency of our own resources.' [2]

When we freely surrender to God's loving, sustaining presence in our lives, our hearts are filled to the brim with 'a peace that passes all understanding' (Phil 4:7), a peace that enables us to rejoice once more in God's outpouring of so many gifts; a peace that reassures us that 'there is no such thing, either in the world or in the heart as a vacuum. And whatever space is really left by apparent emptiness, there is God.' [3]

Building from our present and looking to the future, we want to continue our community with our liturgical and pastoral care with the added dimension of creating a new Church building which will provide a community centre at the heart of Huyton.

And now! We have a chance to dream...together as a Parish and listen to the wider community, we are asking you to contribute your ideas...to have your say and tell us what you would like to see in the church and community centre and the issues we need to focus on.
