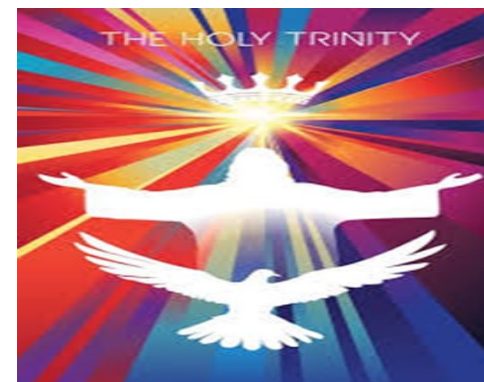

Experiencing the Trinity as Relationship

'We have framed the teaching on the Trinity as a **belief** rather than as **an experience**. Jesus reveals different facets of the mystery of the Trinity:

- The Father is greater than I' (Jn 14:28) : an experience of 'beyondness';
- 'I am in the Father and the Father is in me.' (Jn 14:11): an experience of intimacy;
- 'I and the Father are one.' (Jn 10:30): an experience of oneness, of being inseparable, of total union.' [1]

'These three facets of the Trinitarian experience are not only open to all of us but we need all of them. Any spirituality without all three of these experiences becomes imbalanced. We have those moments in life when we need nothing more than to call out to the God who is greater than us; we have those moments when we need nothing more than intimacy and the experience of belovedness; we have those moments in deep silence when nothing is desired but total union.' A balanced spirituality exercises each facet of this relationship. When Jesus prays that we will experience eternal life, he is inviting everyone to experience being one with God **beyond** us, as transcendent; with God **among** us, incarnate in human life, in creation; and with God **within** us as the Holy Spirit poured into our hearts. Here we have an understanding of the Trinity that moves out of abstract doctrine into intimate experience.' [1]

To experience Trinity is to experience our relationship with God. "Let **us** create humankind in **our** image" (Genesis 1:26). 'In the beginning is relationship. When we start with God as relationship, we begin the spiritual journey with awareness that there has to be a DNA connection between the One who creates and what is created. [2]

Christians use Trinitarian language to describe that relationship. But God is beyond all names, beyond all traditions. 'When we describe God, we can only use similes, analogies and metaphors. All theological language is an approximation, offered tentatively in holy awe' RR 'An image for the names of the Trinity might be an island. It might appear that an island is floating in the vast sea, but actually every island is the tip of a mountain, rooted deep in the fathomless abyss of the ocean. Even more rooted in the fathomless are many names for God. Our names for the Trinity are merely the island that we see sticking out of the sea.' [3] The Feast of the Holy Trinity is not about a doctrine, ideas or concepts. It is a feast of love, a feast of mystery that invites all human beings to participate in God's life.' [4]

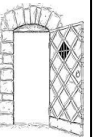
