"Do not let your hearts be troubled"

'Today's gospel is part of Jesus' Farewell Discourse. He knows he is going to die soon and these are his final words to those he loves dearly and who love him dearly. He is like a father describing the inheritance that he's passing on to his children — only Jesus has no things to give; his gift is a way of being. The words of John 14 are often misinterpreted as Jesus speaking about what will happen after the disciples die, a heavenly setting away from earth and this life. But John is the gospel of incarnation, the gospel of life abundantly being realised now, in the flesh, in this life. He's not talking about what people can expect when they die, but what they can expect when they live.

Reassuring his disciples, Jesus says, "Do not let your hearts be troubled. Believe in God, believe also in me. In my Father's house there are many dwelling places. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you?" The phrase "my Father's house" would have been a reference to the temple, which by the time of the writing of this gospel would have been destroyed. Jesus' re-creation of the temple happens within the community of his followers, God's many-roomed house where there is space for everyone to come and rest, to find shelter and to make a home. The presence of faith in our individual lives makes us look on the inside very similar to how the community of faith looks on the outside: a house with many rooms. In the Father's house - the community of faith - there is space for seekers, people who are at peace; people who are grieving, people who are rejoicing; cynics, idealists; thinkers, doers; those who know they're lost and those who are pretty sure they're starting to find something valuable to live for. We also need that kind of space within each of us: room for the seeker and the doubter; space for that part of us that is grieving or rejoicing; room for the thinking part of us and the doing part of us; space to contain all of our experiences that we're not guite sure which room they belong in; a room to store the beautiful things in our life and one to keep safely the troubling things; all under one roof; a spacious place where there's room for all of life's contradictions, held together within God's care.' "Just beyond the storms of personal chaos lies the profound indwelling power of love, the Source and true Centre." [2] Dwelling in that Love we find a new way of being, a new way of seeing what is real and true, a new way of truly living life to the full.
